General Data Protection Regulation Policy

General Data Protection Regulation Policy

With reference to The United Nations Declaration on Human Rights, the European Convention on Human Rights and

the Human Rights Act 2003, Data Protection laws are not adequate for privacy threats and issues today so the Regulation was enacted in 2016 to make the right to privacy supreme in each Member State as a Fundamental Human Right. As a Regulation it comes into effect on 25th May 2018 without any action by the Oireachtas as it has

direct effect, unlike the Directives which led to the Data Protection Acts 1988.and 2003 which required passing of legislation.

This Club has adopted the General Data Protection Regulation Policy of our District 133 to conform with the Act which is set out below.

Lions Clubs International District 133 Ireland is committed to meeting the requirements of the General Data Protection Regulation and the Principles of Data Protection. We know that the member`s personal data is private and important and undertake that our ethos and culture recognise privacy as paramount in Lions Clubs. We confirm that it will not be used for any purpose

other than the objectives and purposes of the Lions Clubs. It will never be divulged to any other body

for any Commercial purposes and only provided to a third party when required by the legitimate interests of Lions Clubs or by law.

When a person applies for membership they will be advised to this effect, will freely and fully

consent to their personal data being used by Lions Clubs International, Lions District 133 Ireland and

the particular Lions Club for the purposes and objects of Lions Clubs only. This consent may be withdrawn at any time. A member has a right to access the information held, which will be provided

immediately, and if inaccurate to have the data amended. When membership ceases for any reason,

the data will be deleted from all records. If a member provides a Personal Public Services Number

for the purpose of a tax refund under Section 848A of the Income Tax Acts, it will only be used for that purpose and only advised to Revenue Charities Section exclusively, as sensitive data. In committing to the Data Protection Principles, the Lions Clubs recognise that it is a Data Controller

and bound to comply with the principles in relation to any personal data collected, stored or processed. They are:

- Obtain and process information fairly;
- Keep it only for one or more specified, explicit and lawful purposes,
- Use and disclose it only in ways compatible with these specified purposes,
- Keep it safe and secure,
- Keep it accurate, complete and up to date,
- Ensure that it is adequate, relevant and not excessive,
- Retain it for no longer than is necessary for the purpose or purposes,
- Give a copy of his/her personal data to an individual on request.

In addition, the Lions Clubs will undertake a programme to ensure compliance by May 2018 with the

G.D.P.R. This will take the form of ten steps to be completed on time and comprise the following :

- Awareness Raising,
- Appoint Data Protection Officer,
- Complete a Data Register,
- Outline basis for Data Collection,
- Communicate Privacy Information,
- Review Data Security and Data Breach Plan,
- Subject Access Requests,
- Privacy by Design,
- Update Policies & Procedures,
- Review Forms and Update.

Lions Clubs International District 133 Ireland will revise all the documentation and notices used by Lions Clubs, will align our processes and policies with the Regulation and ensure that the right to privacy and data protection of all living persons in Lions Clubs are safeguarded.

The Treasurer reported that of the 106 Clubs in the District, 91 were paid up, 15 had not paid, and only 79 had submitted accounts.

Projects included:

- An Post Project to celebrate the Centenary of Lions (Ramor, Jerry)

• Guide Dogs for the Blind, Autusm and Assistance – we have paid our €1500 towards this. There has been €120,000 raised for Breeding in the republic and Training in the North Susan from Ballincolig Lions came with a dog and gave a small presentation.

As a result, 255 males and 152 females were found to be outside the normal ranges and were referred to their GP for follow-up.

Delicata Wine Festival - Malta - August 2018

Here is some information from Peter about this:-

The PROVISIONAL dates for the Delicata Wine festival are the 9th, 10th, 11th and 12thAugust 2018, Valletta will also be Europe's Capital of Culture in 2018.

The wine festival takes place in the Barrakka Gardens overlooking the Grand Harbour, every evening from 7pm until midnight. There are 24 wines to sample as often as one likes from stalls spread along the garden's periphery.

Upper Barrakka Gardens

The way it works is straightforward. Entrance is free. To try the wines, you just purchase a wristband for the night and a personal souvenir glass for €14. As if it were a wine lover's magic wand, showing the wristband at a wine stand will prompt dedicated wine stewards to pour a 60 ml taster of the wine on show in the bespoke festival glass. The last glasses and wristbands are sold at 11pm, the last wine poured at 11.30pm and the festival closes at midnight.

Live cooking stalls will be serving a tempting variety of both traditional Maltese and international dishes to tease a wide range of palates. Maltese favourites are prepared by Maypole, Indian dishes by Gate of India and sushi by MedAsia. There are also various cheese and charcuterie platters as well as desserts to try and match to see for yourself how compatible and versatile Delicata wines are with a variety of cuisines.

Lower Barrakka Gardens

Salute! is a fully-seated al fresco wine and fine dining experience laid on at the reserved, lower level of the Saluting Battery on Friday, Saturday and Sunday night. *Salute!* offers a delicious menu of plated dishes and matching wines, all served under the starry sky over the Grand Harbour which is steeped in history to which every course and each glass aspire to add a new enjoyable chapter. It is

organised by the Delicata winery in close collaboration with Island Caterers. Event tickets are sold at \notin 45 per person.
